Haitian Refugees Protest Lay Volunteer Arrest

Miami (NC) - About 1,000 Haitian refugees in the Miami area observed a daylong prayer vigil, at the request of the bishops of Haiti, to protest the arrest of a Catholic lay volunteer and in petition for freedom from oppression in their homeland.

At the Notre Dame de Haiti Chapel of Miami's Catholic Haitian Center, as well as in the two other centers operated in Pompano Beach and Belle Glade, the Haitians prayed for Gerard Duclerville who was arrested Dec. 29. Ducler-ville, 52, is founder of the Catholic Volunteers, a grassroots lay organization and a radio show host.

The Haitians also responded to a collective letter published in New York's Haiti Observateur newspaper and signed by Archbishop Francois Wolff Ligonde of Port-au-Prince and all of Haiti's bishops calling on Haitians in the United States to observe the prayer vigil.

In their joint letter, the Haitian bishops said, "We will pray to the Lord that our stony hearts be transformed to soft hearts and that the hearts of those who are governing us be instilled with the respect for life and the respect for man as a whole being and for man in general."

Sister Joins

The bishops prayed for Duclerville and for all those in prison. According to Haitian government authorities, Duclerville was released Feb. 7 after more than a month in prison, but they gave no reason for his arrest.

"May the visit of Pope John Paul II (to Haiti in March) become a moment of conversion for those who will meet him as well as those who will listen to him," the bishops said in their letter.

It was reported that in Port-au-Prince the churchowned radio station broadcast prayers "for deliverance of the country from those who are op-pressing it" and for those "who have been oppressed by the government."

Preaching at morning Mass the day of the vigil, Father Thomas Wenski used an old Haitian country proverb: "If the bull knew its force, it wouldn't let the little boy tie a rope around its neck." His words brought applause from the congregation which associated the word bull with the church and the "little boy" with Haitian President-for-life Jean-Cla-ude "Baby Doc" Duvalier.

"It seems the bull is recognizing its force," the priest said in Creole, adding

Archbishop Camara Wins Buddhist Peace Prize By Nancy Frazier

Rome (NC) — A Japanese Buddhist organization has named Brazilian Archbishop Helder Camara as the first winner of its prize for peace.

The award by the Niwano Peace Foundation, which includes a grant of 20 million yen (about \$87,000), was announced simultaneously in Rome and Tokyo Feb. 14.

Nikkyo Niwano, president of the foundation, said in Tokyo that Archbishop Camara, the 74-year-old head of the Brazilian Archdiocese of Olinda and Recife, had been chosen from among 600 candidates in 82 countries by à five-member jury which included Catholic, Islamic and Buddhist representatives.
