

St. Joseph's Villa Honored with Special Day

Lucien Morin, Monroe County manager, and Thomas Ryan, mayor of Rochester, were on hand Tuesday, March 1, to proclaim March 19, 1983, as St. Joseph's Villa Day, and to honor the Villa for its 40-year commitment to the community.

"St. Joseph's Villa has been able to deliver the highest quality of service to this community," said Morin, and Mayor Ryan extended the community's gratitude and

thanks to the staff at St. Joseph's.

Both men noted that St. Joseph's Villa is presently involved in a \$1,350,000 capital fund-raising campaign. Ryan referred to the the campaign as "an ambitious but necessary undertaking which, if achieved, will enable the Villa to continue its service to children, families and the community."

The proclamations were accepted by Sister Judith

McKay, SSJ, executive director of the Villa. "I am very touched," she said, "by this strong statement of support."

Also present for the ceremony were Don Riley, Greece town supervisor; Larry Oberlies, vice-president of the Villa's Board of Directors; and Robert Flavin, leader of the Community Groups Division of the Villa's campaign.

The Villa is a residential treatment facility which serves emotional handicapped, delinquent, and neglected children. It is through the current fund-raising campaign that an educational complex is planned for the Dewey Avenue campus which will house classrooms, a library, a day treatment wing, and gymnasium.

Sister Ann Loretta, SSJ

Mass of Christian Burial for Sister Anne Loretta Riesenberger, SSJ, was celebrated in the motherhouse chapel Feb. 28. Sister Anne Loretta died in St. Joseph's Hospital in Elmira Feb. 26, 1983. She was 66.

Bishop Joseph L. Hogan, retired Bishop of Rochester, presided at the rites celebrated by Msgr. William H. Shannon and Father John DeSocio.

Sister Ann Loretta was born in Rochester and entered the Sisters of St. Joseph from Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish in 1931. In 1933 she began a five-year term of teaching, two years at Holy Trinity in Webster, three at St. Alphonsus in Auburn.

She was taken ill and

hospitalized at St. Joseph's Hospital. In 1943 she began work at the hospital in various capacities: assistant housekeeper, linen room assistant, manager of the gift shop and assistant in the volunteer program.

She was a member of the hospital auxiliary from its foundation in 1954, and was a major contributor to the gift shop which featured ceramics and knitted or crocheted items. She retired in 1978, but continued to be active in a volunteer capacity.

Sister Ann Loretta is survived by a sister, Mrs. Aloysius (Florence) Fien of Rochester; three brothers, George and Joseph of Rochester, William of Houston, Texas; and several nieces, nephews, grandnieces and grandnephews.
