

prayer, especially the use of a prayer book. There is a little 32-page booklet, Treasury of Prayers, which has a good collection of traditional prayers, plus others, published by the Liturgical Press. I have sold thousands of them, offering them "five for \$1, available at the exits of the church." The books are sold below cost, but it gives me great joy to know that many people are praying who otherwise would not; and many youngsters who do not know the ordinary prayers now have an instrument to learn from, urged on by grandparents, parents and religion teachers.

After the sessions in the hall, the group returned to the church for the final conference, "The Com-munion of Saints and Padre Pio." And we concluded with benediction conducted by Father Cason. I was tickled to meet four young women who were gradeschoolers 40 years ago. One came forward: "You don't remember me." With a big smile I replied: "I certainly do! You're Jane Reed and fired you out of high school religion class one day for being so annoying." It's funny that we remember the unusual, and how youngsters we would like to murder become such wonderfully loyal pillars of the parish. Julia DiPrimo came and planted a big kiss on my right cheek. Mary Benedict, a double pillar of the parish, startled me by saying: "Will you recommend a book on Cardinal Newman. You speak so highly of him, and I always was a bit turned against him." questions in people's minds



Immaculate Conception Church is a beautiful stone Gothic church, seating 700 persons. There are five Sunday Masses, plus one in Newfield. Father Cason gave me the noon Mass and the pulpit. So the Day of Renewal began: first with Mass; then the group went to the brand new, spacious parish hall underneath the church for settling. Then a brief introduction, followed by a dish-to-pass lunch with luscious quiche. pastas. vegetables and cakes. At each place I set a slip of paper and a pencil to prepare for a question period. The slip read: "This I have often wondered about" with lines to fill in a question e.g., "Why are our children not taught to memorize the ordinary Catholic prayers?" I have found this simple device effective to get
