What Happened **To Passion Sunday?**

Passion Sunday used to be celebrated the fifth Sunday of Lent, just two weeks before Easter. It began the liturgical time of passiontide which lasted until the Easter vigil.

While Passion Sunday no longer exists as such, Catholics these days still relive the passion on both Palm/Passion Sunday and Good Friday.

A spokesman for the diocese said that it seemed historically wrong to note the passion before Christ even arrived in Jerusalem, "which event really should be the overture to the entire Easter symphony.'

"It was an historical accident to celebrate the passion out of place," the spokesman said. To make it more chronologically correct and to integrate into the Resurrection celebration, it is necessary to relive the passion on Palm/Passion Sunday and Good Friday.
