Pope Officially Opens Holy Year

Vatican City (NC) — With three symbolic taps of a gold and ivory hammer, Pope John Paul II opened the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica March 25 and began the 394-day Holy Year of Redemption.

After the solemn door opening, the pope led 100,000 people in prayer that the year would "change the direction of the mounting threats and disasters in the modern

"The world seems to be traveling in a direction perilous for all," the pope said. "Help us to change the direction . . . do not permit the work of destruction that threatens humanity today."

The Holy Door, to the right of the main entrance of the basilica, was officially opened at 5:40 p.m., after a penitential procession from the Church of St. Stephen of the Abyssinians inside the Vatican.

Thousands gathered to watch the procession, despite an intermittent rain and strong winds.

The pope pronounced the three traditional Latin phrases with each tap of the door:

"Open to me the doors of justice. This is the door of the Lord. I enter into your house,

it as a whole." The committee also looks forward to receiving the bishops' responses in the form of their suggested amendments and to their deliberations and approval at the Chicago meeting, he said.

Since the bishops discussed the proposed pastoral — then in its second draft — at their November 1982 meeting, the ad hoc panel had received almost 400 pages of comments from bishops and others, had had the "benefit of helpful insights during the consultation" with other nations' bishops in Rome last January and had "had further useful exchanges with administration representatives," Cardinal Bernardin said.

He added that in the third draft "particular attention has been given to the treatment of Scripture, to the relationship of the 'just war' theory and non-violence in the Catholic tradition, to the discussion of U.S. and Soviet policies and relationships, to the moral argumentation on the question of deterrence, to the presentation of practical strategies for peace, and in particular to the distinction between moral principles and their application to concrete circumstances in order to clarify the different levels of moral authority in the document.

1983 has been announced by His Holiness Pope John Paul II to be a special Holy Year, in commemoration of the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ which occurred one thousand, nine-hundred and fifty years ago. The celebrations of the Holy Year commenced on February 16, 1983, the first day of Lent.

During a Holy Year the pope grants to the faithful, under particular circuinstances, Plenary Indulgence, or general forgiveness.

On the occasion of the Holy Year 1750, Pope Benefict XIV laid down the requirements necessary to be granted a Plenary Indulgence. They consist of (1) a visit to the four major Basilicas of Rome - St. Peter's, St. Paul's, St. John Laterna, and St. Mary Major; (2) the sacraments of Confession and Communion; and (3) special prayers for the intentions of the

Although Holy Year has its roots in ancient tradition, it is profoundly relevant to us today ... it aims at nothing less than the spiritual renewal of man. The pilgrim who visits the Eternal city lives firsthand the glory, traditions, and faith of the Church.
