**'Faith and Sharing' Is Theme of Retreat**

A retreat, based on the ideas of l'Arche founder Jean Vanier, will be given 7 p.m., Thursday, June 30 through 1 p.m., Monday, July 4 at Murphy Hall on the St. John Fisher College campus.

The event, called, "Faith and Sharing," will be led by Sister Marie Paradis, CSJ, and Mario Galeazzi, both of Toronto.

The program is unique in that it is open to the general public, including laity, clergy, religious, the able and the mentally and physically handicapped.

The program is new to Rochester, although it has seen great success in Canada.

The Rochester event is being sponsored by Father William Frankhauser, SJ, head of the local l'Arche community, and Joan and Jack McTigue.

"One of the unique features of the retreat," a press release stated, "is that no one is excluded and all who attend participate. The retreat is for all seeking, abled and disabled, young, not so young and old, lay people, religious and clergy. We will gather together to try to become more responsible to the graces that God has given us. We have been given many talents that we may not be aware of because of fear, hurt and pain. Together we may be able to see in each other what those talents are."

The l'Arche movement began in 1964 in Trosly, France, to give handicapped people an alternative to institutional living. Today, it is an "international federation

of communities where mentally handicapped and 'normal' people live and work together," a brochure on the movement stated.

The fee of \$80 per person includes four nights lodging and 11 meals. Further information is available from Father Frankhauser, 232-2413, or the McTigues, 889-2134.
