New Health Center Opened by Westside

Services new Woodward Health Center was formally dedicated Saturday at 480 Genesee St.

Highlighting the ceremony was a national award to Dr. Kenneth Woodward, a prominent Rochester physician who founded the neighborhood health center concept here and for whom the new center is named. He was presented with the National Association of Community Health Centers' annual award for excellence.

Also honored were Virginia Sommerville, a longtime patient of Westside Health Services, and Lester Holcomb of Florida, execuitive director of Westside who was instrumental in opening the new center.

The center actually opened for patient care in February and provides medical, dental, counseling and social services primarily to residents of the

The Westside Health city's 3rd, 11th and 19th wards. It replaces Westside's former Millbank facility.

In addition to providing complete primary medical and dental care, Westside's community health care concept offers social and counseling services including a teen program, specialized refugee health services and an infant development program. Westside also operates two drop-in neighborhood storefront health education programs at 622 Jefferson Ave. and 210 Lyell Ave.

In addition, Westside operates the Brown Square Health Center on Lyell Avenue. Westside is part of the Rochester Health Network, a network of community health centers and Monroe Plan physicians serving greater Rochester.

Westside has contracted with St. Mary's Hospital for management of the centers and their outreach program.


He served a year as assistant director of St. Francis Home for Adults in Richmond.
