Parish to Renew Stewardship Plan

HORNELL -- St. Ignatius Loyola Parish here will renew the Christian Stewardship Program that was first introduced to parishioners two years ago.

The initial program stressed the three "Ts" of Christian stewardship -- time, talent and treasure. Father Leo J. Mans, pastor, said that more than 200 families volunteered to assist the parish in various religious and social projects over the past two years. The 1983 program, in addition to appealing for volunteers to staff the necessary areas of time and talent, will place emphasis on the parish's commitment to Catholic education.

"St. Ignatius parishioners are very fortunate to have a strong, viable Catholic elementary school as an alternate choice in academic excellence in the Hornell area," Father Mans said.

St. Ann's here is the only Catholic elementary school in the area between Bath, Dansville, Wayland and Wellsville. Recent changes in school busing regulations make it possible for pupils other than parishioners of St. Ann's to attend the elementary school. Father Mans said St. Ignatius will be totally committed to support St. Ann's School.

Other projects to receive attention, when funding is available, will be the painting of the church interior and new carpeting. Cost estimates for these two projects is \$18,000. No specific amount has yet been determined for the parish's Catholic Education subsidy. The parish will not go into debt to accomplish these objectives, Father Mans said.

Healing Mass Scheduled in Mt. Morris

Father Vincent P. McCorry, SJ, will conduct the sixth annual Sacred Heart Triduum June 8 to 10 at St. Joseph's Church, 6105 Rush Lima Road. Father McCorry is a member of the staff of Sacred Heart Retreat House, Shrine of the North American Martyrs, Auriesville.

A triduum is a three-day devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which is commemorated during the month of June. Father McCorry also will preach at all Masses June 4-5.

A native of New Jersey, Father McCorry was graduated from St. Augustine's parochial school and Xavier High School in New York City.

For his noviceship and classical studies he attended St. Andrew-on-Hudson, Poughkeepsie, from 1927 to 1931. He finished Woodstock College, Maryland, with AB and MAS degrees in philosophy in 1934. He was an instructor in classics at Loyola College, Baltimore, from 1934 to 1937 and taught Theology at Woodstock College from 1937 to 1941. He was ordained at Woodstock in 1940.

He has been an assistant professor in English at Canisius, Fordham and LeMoyné and he conducts missions, retreats and spiritual renewals throughout the country. He was associate editor of the Jesuit weekly America, wrote a weekly column, The Word, and served a year as associate editor of the Star, diocesan newspaper
