

# Monaghan Is First In Sports Limelight

Ellen Monaghan was named the Greater Greece Athlete of the year at the eighth annual Athletes Banquet on May 19 at the Mapledale Party House. The award, sponsored each year by Manufacturers Hanover, is based on the voting of Aquinas, Greece Athena, Arcadia, Olympia, Hilton, Cardinal Mooney, Spencerport and Nazareth Academy coaches. There were 71 nominees for this year's award.

Ellen is the first female athlete from a Catholic school to win the award and is also the first athlete to be the unanimous vote of the judges. Ellen has been captain of every team she has played on since freshman year which include soccer, volleyball, basketball and softball. In addition to being named to the Democrat & Chronicle's "Super 15" Basketball Team, she has been a first team all-star private-parochial for all four sports. She was the school Athlete of the Year in 1982 and 1983 and has been school MVP in all four sports.


