

# Scott Kubinski To Be Ordained Deacon June 18

Bishop Matthew H. Clark will ordain Scott M. Kubinski to the Order of Deacon at 10 a.m. on Saturday, June 18 at Sacred Heart Cathedral.

The ordinand is the son of Edward and Dorothy Kubinski of Elmira, and is a member of St. Casimir's Parish there.

He attended Notre Dame High School and graduated from St. John Fisher College, Rochester, in 1977 with a BA in psychology.

Kubinski entered St. Bernard's Seminary in the

Fall of 1979 and completed his theological studies this past Spring at Immaculate Conception Seminary in Mahwah, N.J.

For his Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE), Kubinski worked at Westborough State Hospital in Massachusetts during the Summer, 1981.

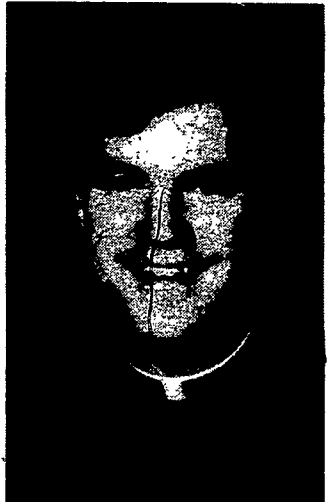

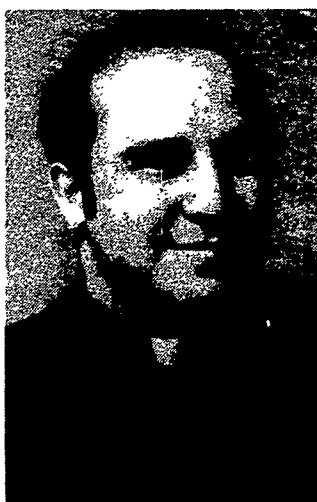

# Deacon Interns Appointed

Bishop Matthew H. Clark announced last week the appointments of four area men as Deacon Interns.

Scott Kubinski is the last in a group to be ordained, and will reach that level on June 18. He joins Rev. Mr. Frank DiSano, Rev. Mr. David Faraone, and Rev. Mr. Richard Farrell. The three were ordained last August by Bishop Clark at Sacred Heart Cathedral.

Kubinski has been assigned to St. Charles Borromeo Church, Greece.

Rev. Mr. DiSano, son of Frank and Josephine DiSano, was born July 21, 1955. He attended St. James School, St. Cecilia School, Bishop Kearney

High School and Monroe Community College prior to entering the Becket Hall program at St. John Fisher College.

He graduated in 1977 with a BA in psychology. He studied at St. Bernard's Seminary and completed his seminary training at Immaculate Conception Seminary in Mahwah, N.J.

He took his Clinical Pastoral Education at Atascadero State Hospital in California, a maximum security hospital for the criminally insane.

He has served as youth family minister at St. Margaret Mary Church, Irondequoit; at the Tribunal office for the Archdiocese of Newark; as a worker at Valley Hospital

in Richmond, N.J.; at the Rochester Friendly Home, St. Philip Neri and Camp Stella Maris.

In addition, his present assignment, St. Michael, Newark, marks a return for him. He did field work there 1978-79.

Rev. Mr. Faraone, son of Dominick and Christine Faraone is 27. He attended St. Augustine School, McQuaid Jesuit High School, St. John Fisher College, and SUNY Albany from which he earned a BA in psychology, St. Bernard's and Immaculate Conception. He did field work at St. Theresa's Church in Cresskill, N.J.; St. Theodore, Rochester and the development office at St. Bernard's.

He took his CPE at the Veterans Hospital in Loma Linda, Calif., in 1981.

He has been assigned to Our Mother of Sorrows Church.

Rev. Mr. Farrell is a Rochester native, a graduate of Edison Tech. He earned a BA in psychology from St. John Fisher College, a BA in religious studies from St. Bernard's Seminary, and a MDiv from Theological College at Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C.
