### Our Lady Number One

Father Charles Farrell, OP, is a friend from WWII days in England and France, 1944-1945. I was a chaplain. He was in communications and a wonderful help to me. After the war, he went to Providence College and entered the Dominicans. Today he is prior of the Dominican Community at their House of Studies in Washington. He invited me to visit him so I made a double-header, visiting Jesuit Father Kavanaugh for three days in Maryland and spending three days at the Dominican House.

Directly across from the priory is the campus of Catholic University and the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception.

Friday afternoon I went to the shrine to study the gorgeous mosaics, statues, stained glass windows and the marble pillars and walls. Suddenly in the crypt I met two of Mother Teresa's Missionary Sisters. I approached them.

"Sisters, I have never met any of your Sisters but recognize you from your habit." I continued, "I recently read a book about the Moonies by ex-Moonie Steve Kellerman from Rochester. He went to our McQuaid Jesuit High School and then to Berkely University and within six months was sucked into the Moonies. The book, 'The Lord of the Second Coming,' unfolds the techniques and life and doctrine and tenacity of the Moonie cult. Steve was so absorbed by them that his parents kidnapped him to have him de-programmed. I'd like to send you a copy."

One Sister paused, and looking down the corridor, said, "Oh, there is Mother Superior. I would like to have her permission." It turned out

that the Sisters are rigid about poverty and the book might be a material possession. So I said, "Well, let's go and see Number One." She laughed: "Oh, no, Father. Our Lady is Number One. The Superior is Number Two."

Number Two turned out to be a beautiful woman of tranquil charm, about 50 years old. We conversed. "We have a Sister Shawn from Rochester who is a novice with us in New York. She was with the Sisters of St. Joseph for more than 20 years. She's beautiful and doing beautifully." Evidently Sister was thinking about the Moonie lad. "How is that young man now?"

"He's fine. Evidently an idealist. He spent this past January to May with your Missionaries in Calcutta. Mother Teresa told him to go back to the States, finish his education. He could do more good there. She said: 'The United States is one of the poorest of countries.'" By this she meant that though we have great material things, we are impoverished by lack of real love.

As we parted, I pondered over the life of these Sisters: traditional community life -- meditation, rosary, Holy Hour, together; meals, together; Mass and thanksgiving and spiritual reading, together; Rigid poverty. Obedience with the generosity of the early Jesuits. The religious habit, silently proclaiming Christ's service and presence among the poorest of the poor. Despite the rigidity of their constitution and life, vocations increase, and the Sisters stay. As we were parting, I asked the Superior: "What will happen to your Order when Mother Teresa dies?" She said: "Oh, it will do very well. Mother Teresa will take care of us from heaven."

## El Salvador Trial Pressed by Senator

Washington (NC) -- Sen. Patrick Leahy (D-Vt.) has introduced a Senate resolution which would pressure El Salvador to begin a jury trial by Dec. 2 in the deaths of four U.S. women missionaries.

Under the legally non-binding resolution introduced Aug. 1, the Senate would urge the Reagan administration to "call upon" the Salvadoran government

to appoint a special prosecutor to "oversee the comprehensive investigation of those responsible for murdering the four American churchwomen and to prepare a thorough and effective prosecution against them."

The resolution also asks El Salvador to assure the United States that those accused of the slayings will be brought to jury trial by Dec. 2, 1983, the third anniversary of the

missionaries' deaths.

"As an American I am deeply concerned about the

lack of justice in this case,"

Leahy said at a press conference.
