The curriculum, developed to teach the basic truths of the Catholic faith, is focused on clearly stated objectives for each specific grade level. The four types of objectives are Bible, Prayer, Doctrine and Social Justice. The Bible is the basic "textbook" for Christianity therefore it has a significant place in the curriculum and each child from grade 4 to 8 is encouraged to his or her own Bible.

All teachers have been in-

be provided during the year for teachers to attend classes and/or in service to keep them abreast on changes in the Church and more in depth study of Scripture.

A day has been planned for the teacher to focus on Social Justice and the teachings of the Church

Each eighth grade student is required to take a Standardized Religion Inventory Test which comes from the National Catholic Education Association in Washington, D.C. It has two specific parts. The doctrinal section which includes knowledge in the areas of God, Church, troduced to the new curricu- Sacraments, Christian Life,

and an attitudinal section which reflects student attitudes on specific questions. Our students have been participating in the program since 1978. Over the past six years, administrators have seen a definite precentage increase in each area, especially Sacraments and Christian Life which reflected big increases.

The results from these tests are used to formulate the Religion Curriculum, to study the religion program in each school and to make decisions regarding the choice of religion textbooks.
