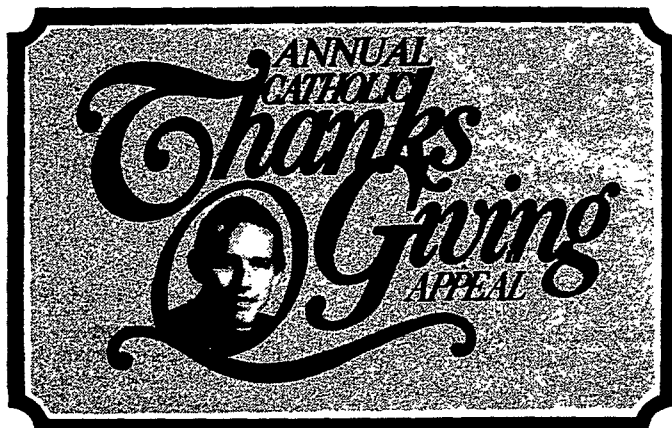

Respect Life Sunday

- Abortion is "a complete denial of an unborn child's personhood," Bishop Matthew H. Clark says in a Respect Life Sunday message.
- An infanticide forum is scheduled for Oct. 21 under the co-sponsorship of the diocesan Human Life Commission and the St. Thomas More lawyers Guild.
- In a related story, Pope John Paul says those who use artificial conception are assuming for themselves the role of God and reject providence.
- The diocesan Human Life Commission has sent packets of materials for Respect Life Sunday to pastors throughout the diocese.
