Quest for Peace

Auburn Parishes Plan Rosary Peace Rallies

Auburn — Representatives of a number of area Catholic churches are planning a Rosary for Peace Rally, 7:30 p.m., Oct. 3-7 in Market Square Park.

Organized by Father Joseph Catanise, associate pastor of St. Mary's Church, and Ed Britton of the parish, the event will feature recitation of the rosary, a talk by a guest speaker and a discussion period at St. Mary's, after which refreshments will be served.

The purpose of the rally is three-fold, according to Britton. "We are focusing attention on the need to pray and work for peace, to support the American Catholic bishops who speak out for peace, and to encourage Catholics to read and discuss the bishops' pastoral letter, 'The Challenge of Peace: God's Promise and Our Response'," Britton said.

Representatives from St. Mary's, St. Hyacinth's, St. Francis, Holy Family, Sacred Heart and St. Patrick in Monrovia participated in the original planning.

All parishes in the area, and the public at large have been invited to participate.

Bishop Schedules Hearing on Peace

Bishop Matthew H. Clark will meet with diocesans from the Finger Lakes Region from 3 to 5 p.m., Sunday, Oct. 9, at the St. Patrick School gym in Seneca Falls to discuss his participation in the Oct. 22 peace rally at Romulus.

Anyone interested in speaking at the hearing must complete a request form available from his or her parish. The completed form must be received at the Finger Lakes Social Ministry office no later than Wednesday, Oct. 5. Speakers will be scheduled on a first come basis.

Preference will be given those speakers who represent a group, for example, a parish council, human development committee, religious community, etc.

The hearing will be open to all, but only those persons/groups with confirmed appointments will be allowed to make three-minute statements.

Col. John Wilson, the commanding officer of the Seneca Army Depot, has been invited by Bishop Clark to make a statement.

Bishop Clark's topic at the peace rally will be "The Role of the Church in the Quest for Peace." Sponsored by the Seneca Depot October Action Committee, the rally is part of an international weekend of activities to protest the deployment of Pershing II and Cruise missiles to Europe. Many believe the weapons are stored at the Seneca Army Depot.

Peace Prayer Vigils Scheduled Oct. 21

Prayer vigils are scheduled throughout the diocese on Oct. 21, the eve of the peace rally at Sampson State Park at which Bishop Matthew H. Clark will speak. The vigils are being coordinated by the diocesan Office of Liturgy and the diocesan steering committee on the "Challenge of Peace" in conjunction with parishes in each diocesan region.

The vigils are in accordance with the bishop's request "to make Friday a special day of prayer, almsgiving, fast and abstinence" for peace.

All diocesans are encouraged to schedule some time during the vigil's hours of 8 to 11 p.m. to take part in the services at the following churches:
