The project, amounting to about \$19 million, will be divided into 20 trade categories, with each bid separately and awarded to the lowest qualified bidder, based on federal policies. Mc Bro expects that the threeyear construction period will provide about 75 jobs.

John Renz, hospital planning director, said that the construction project will require a new steel structure to be built over and through an existing building, a concrete structure to be built over an existing building and a new steel and glass lobby entrance area for an existing building.
