SSJ Leaders Applaud Sister Demonstrators

The central administration of the diocesan Sisters of St. Joseph issued a statement of support for members of the congregation who took part in the civil disobedience at Seneca Army Depot, Oct. 24.

Two members of the congregation, Sister Marilyn Pray and Sister Kathleen Cosgrove, entered federal property during a demonstration against nuclear weapons and the deployment of Pershing II and Cruise missiles. Sister Beatrice

Ganley, also a Sister of St. Joseph, abetted the action.

"We know that these Sisters made their decision to do so only after serious consideration and prayer and in dialogue with us," the statement said.

"We agree with their opposition to the nuclear arms build-up as a threat to the life of the entire planet, and we respect their choice to voice this opposition through non-violent civil disobedience.

"We believe that this is in accord with the call of our bishops, rooted in the teachings of our faith, with our history as a congregation, and with our deepest personal convictions," the statement concluded.

Nuke Freeze Rejected But Still Not Dead

Washington (NC) -- The Senate rejected an attempt Oct. 31 to attach a nuclear freeze resolution to an unrelated piece of legislation, but left open the possibility that the freeze issue could be resurrected later this year or next.

On a 58-40 vote the Senate agreed to table an effort to attach the freeze resolution to a measure raising the national debt limit.

Later it voted 84-13 against a motion to table an alternative "build-down" nuclear weapons proposal. But the build-down amendment was withdrawn before a final vote in an effort to keep the debt limit bill free of extraneous measures.

The actions meant that the non-binding freeze resolution still could be brought to the Senate floor as a separate bill or as an amendment to

another measure. But opponents of the freeze, such as Sen. Sam Nunn (D-Ga.), who have urged the build-down proposal as an alternative, said the Senate votes made clear where the body stands on the issue.

The Democratic-controlled House earlier this year approved a version of the freeze resolution by a 278-149 vote.
