

Charities Units Get Grants For Rural, Hispanic Unwed

The Finger Lakes Office of Social Ministry and the Catholic Family Center of Rochester have received awards from the Maternity and Early Childhood Foundation to help pregnant teenagers, teen mothers and their infants. The grants total \$40,340. The two Catholic Charities agencies were among 13 groups receiving grants throughout the state.

A 1982 state study said teenage pregnancy is the greatest single cause of welfare dependency.

Giovina Caroscio, director of FLOSM, cited 124 births

to teen mothers in Ontario County in 1980 and noted that volunteers at the Geneva Ecumenical Community Lunch Program this Summer observed increased tensions between unwed mothers under stress and their preschool children. Child abuse in Ontario County is higher than the state-wide average.

The FLOSM program received \$20,340 to conduct public forums on the problems of the unwed parent, training from Church personnel on concomitant problems of early pregnancies, recruiting and training

volunteers for group counseling work and establishing support groups for up to 35 unwed pregnant women.

Catholic Family Center, which developed its proposal with Ibero-American Action League of Rochester, will organize services to reach an increased number of Hispanic teenagers in the Rochester area. Catherine Wobus, casework director of the CFC, noted that Hispanics face many serious difficulties, including a 57-percent school drop-out rate.

In addition, 60 percent of

Hispanic families live below the poverty level causing increased stress for young Hispanics.

Ms. Wobus estimated that there are approximately 850 births to Hispanic women between 10 and 21 annually. The CFC project will employ a bilingual Hispanic social worker to reach out to teens and their families through churches, neighborhood centers and schools to obtain health, education and counseling services. CFC was awarded \$20,000 for the project.

Cdl. Bernardin To Head Bishops Pro-Life Unit

Washington (NC) -- Cardinal Joseph Bernardin of Chicago has been named chairman of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee for Pro-Life Activities.

He succeeds Cardinal Terence Cooke of New York, who died Oct. 6.

Cardinal Bernardin was asked to head the committee by Archbishop John R. Roach of St. Paul-Minneapolis, NCCB president, who expressed "gratification that Cardinal Bernardin will lend his outstanding leadership skills to the conference's efforts to promote the sanctity of human life at every stage and in every circumstance."

Cardinal Bernardin was chairman of the committee responsible for drafting the bishops' pastoral on war and peace, "The Challenge of Peace: God's Promise and Our Response." The pastoral was approved in May.


