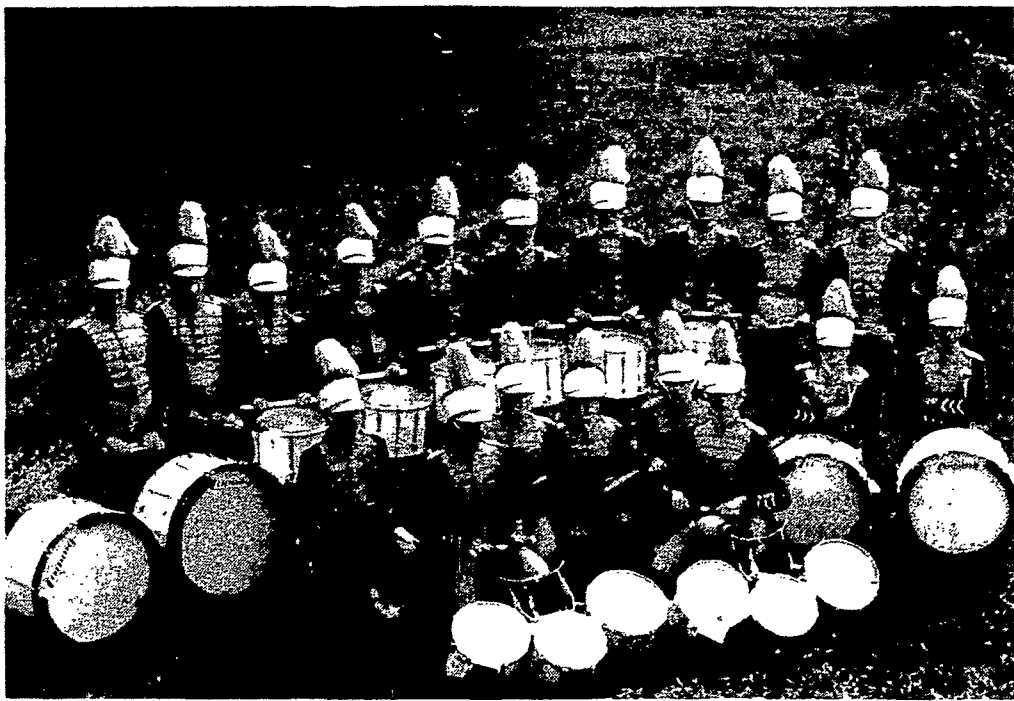
Jazz Time For The Schools
