LCWR to Celebrate Jubilee Day . . . **But Not in Rome**

Silver Spring, Md. (NC) --The officers of the Leadership Conference of Women Religious will not attend the Feb. 2 Jubilee Day for Religious at the Vatican, but the organization is planning to mark the occasion in other wavs.

Divine Providence Sister Lora Ann Quinonez, executive director of the LCWR, said that former members of the conference working in Rome will represent the conference at a Feb. 1 encounter on Religious life.

An Aug. 30 letter to Religious, which Sister Quinonez said was not received until late October, offered alternative suggestions for Religious to celebrate the Holy Year.

The letter, sent from Archbishop Mario Schierano, head of the Holy Year Committee, asked Religious to continue their solidarity with the poor, which Sister Quinonez said, right down our alley."

Members of the conference

will be informed of the Holy Year activities in the LCWR's next newsletter, she said, and they will be asked to focus their care for the poor particularly on the people of Central America.

The conference also will "ask all retired sisters in the United States to pray in thanksgiving" for the meaning of Religious life in the past and for its future, Sister Quinonez said.

"Given the special circumstances" of the U.S. church and the Vatican's message to U.S. bishops on Religious life, "an important part of our celebration of the jubilee is to reflect on that,' she said.

Sister Quinonez said Archbishop Schierano's letter contained a "very brief allusion" to obedience to the pope, which she felt did not overemphasize the pontiff as Religious' ultimate superior.

The letter said the Feb. 2 Mass would include a renewal of vows "into the hands of the Holy Father.'


As we celebrate Mary's fulfillment of God's plan in the awesomeness of Christmas, we can only wonder what that response, one similar to hers, might mean for us


