Nazareth Academy Is Searching For Graduates

The Nazareth Academy Alumnae Association has been busy the past few months trying to locate "lost" graduates. According to school sources, out of approximately 17,000 graduates, only 13,000 are known to be verified by name and address.

"Of course, being women, the change of name doesn't help us," said Sister Maria Pacelli, alumnae secretary. "Our graduates often don't think to contact us when they move or marry, and then they wonder why they haven't heard from their high school," she added.

Coming up are two alumnae projects: The third

annual Gold and Blue Campaign fundraiser, beginning in March with a mailing and followed up in May with a phone-a-thon, through which Nazareth graduates donate scholarship money to the school; The annual banquet, in May, to honor the anniversary classes. A personal invitation is mailed to every member of an anniversary class.

"Once again, alumnae want to know about the banquet, but fail to let us know their updated address," commented Sister Maria and added, "Nazareth Academy graduates are welcome to call the school to give their addresses at any time."

Michael Carney Dies Known for Charities

A memorial Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated Feb. 18 at Our Lady of Lourdes Church for J. Michael Carney who died Sunday, Feb. 12, 1984.

Mr. Carney was known among colleagues, friends and family for his charitable activities. He was 51 at the time of his death.

Born in Rochester, Mr. Carney was a graduate of Aquinas Institute, and was a member of the "pioneer class" of St. John Fisher College. He served two years in the Army in Germany. From 1957-1967, he worked for Burroughs Corp. He worked briefly for both the New York State Agency for Surplus and for Michaels,

Stern and Co., and, in 1973, joined Gannett Rochester Newspapers as advertising services manager.

Among his Church associations were the St. John Fisher Alumni Association and the parish council of Our Lady of Lourdes.

On the occasion of his death, he was widely praised for his singular evidence of charity, devotion to duty and expression of faith.

Mr. Carney is survived by his wife, Mary Frances Carney; seven children, Martin, Joseph, James, Marian, Eileen, Andrew and Anne Carney; his sister, Joan Carney Deaton of Maryland; and several nieces and nephews.

'Unfaithfully Yours' Isn't All that Funny

New York (NC) — In 1948 Preston Sturges made what may well have been his best film, a brilliant satiric comedy about a famous conductor, played superbly by Rex Harrison, who suspects his beautiful, much younger wife (Linda Darnell) of adultery. In the course of conducting three pieces, Harrison fantasizes about how he will vindicate his honor and revenge himself upon the perfidious woman and her lover.

The fantasies, worked out in elaborate detail, vary in mood and intent according to

the mood and intent of the particular piece that inspires them. Then in a final hilarious sequence, the conductor goes home and tries to carry out his fantasies with results such as you might expect.

I saw the Sturges movie when it came out and have not seen it since, but I still remember how convulsed I was by one sequence in which Harrison can't get the arm of a phonograph to behave as tractably as it did in his fantasy.

Now we have a remake with the same title, "Unfaithfully Yours" (Fox), and with the ubiquitous Dudley Moore and Natassja Kinski in the Harrison and Darnell roles. The most that can be said for director Howard Zieff and the trio of writers — Valerie Curtin, Barry Levinson and Robert Klane — is that their intentions were no doubt honorable and they really wanted to do justice to the Sturges original, which, not so incidentally, was a commercial failure.

The remake, however, has none of the wit and style of the original. The heart of the Sturges film, the music-inspired fantasies, have been reduced to insignificance. There's only one of them.


The filmmakers instead give Moore a blank check to transact the film, the winsome petulance, the drunken walk and the pratfalls that constitute the bag of tricks upon which this talented and appealing performer has been depending entirely too much of late.

"Unfaithfully Yours" is an expensively mounted

comedy but not a very funny one. Though otherwise innocuous, moreover, it is marred by an ill-conceived shower scene and bedroom sequence that caused the U.S. Catholic Conference to give it an O — morally offensive — classification. The Motion Picture Association of America has rated it PG — parental guidance suggested.
