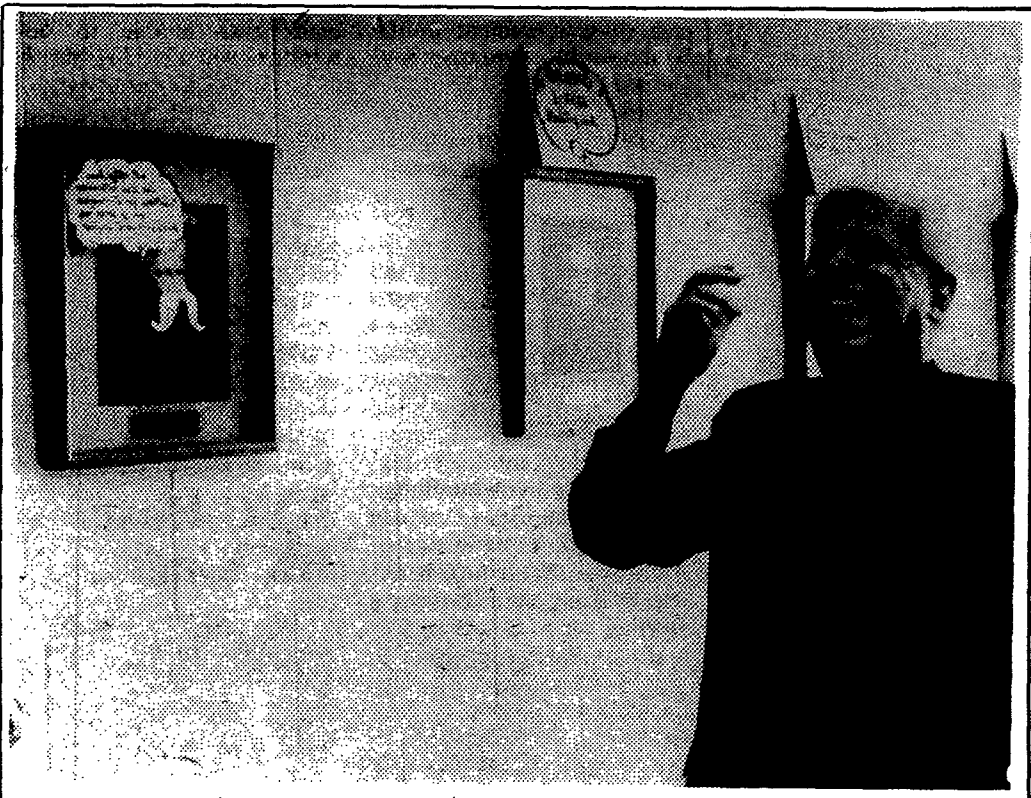

## Pope to Consecrate World to Mary during March 25 Celebration

Vatican City (NC) -- Pope John Paul II will consecrate the world to Mary during the Vatican's March 25 Holy Year of the Redemption celebration for families.

The consecration will take place within a series of activities, chief among them a Mass for families in St. Peter's Basilica and a meeting in the Paul VI audience hall.

Representatives of family organizations from throughout the world are expected to attend the celebration.

At the Vatican, the family celebration will begin with hymns in various languages before a Mass in which couples will renew their marriage vows.

On the same day, during the noontime Angelus, the pope will offer his apostolic blessing to all the families of

the world.

Later in the afternoon, the pope will go to the Paul VI audience hall to attend a program which will include entertainment, reflection and prayer by the representatives of families from throughout the world.

In a letter dated Dec. 8 and released by the U.S. bishops Feb. 14, the pope asked the world's bishops to join him in consecrating the world to Mary on March 24 or 25.

March 25 is the feast of the Annunciation, when the Angel Gabriel appeared to the Blessed Virgin and announced that she was to be the mother of God.

Because the feast falls on a Sunday this year, bishops are free to anticipate the celebration of the feast on March 24, as will be done in the United States.

## SSJs to Celebrate Patron's Feast Day

"Graced history" is the theme of the annual St. Joseph's day celebration planned for 2 p.m., Saturday, March 17 at the Sisters of St. Joseph Motherhouse, 4095 East Avenue. Bishop Matthew H. Clark will celebrate the Liturgy.

At noon the sisters will gather at St. Joseph's Convent and Infirmary to share in a dessert table with the retired members of the congregation. For the Liturgy

the sisters have been reviewing and learning a Latin Mass composed in 1950 by Sister Florian Reichert in honor of the congregation's 300th anniversary. Following the religious service there will be media presentations on the works of the Sisters of St. Joseph at Nazareth College, St. Joseph's Hospital, and other areas of service. A buffet will then be served in the Motherhouse dining room followed by a songfest and Irish dancing.

## CBS to Air Docudrama About Pope

New York (NC) -- A three-hour docudrama, "Pope John Paul II," shown last November at a fundraising dinner sponsored by the New York Archdiocese, will be broadcast by CBS April 22, Easter Sunday.

The film, starring Albert Finney, traces the life of Pope John Paul from his early days in Poland to his installation as pope. The program will be shown at 8 p.m. EST.

Directed by Herbert Wise from a script by Christopher Knopf, the film was made in cooperation with the New York Archdiocese and the Vatican.

The film was used by the archdiocese for a fundraiser Nov. 2 at the Lincoln Center in New York "for the Polish people as a tribute to the pope," according to Dominican Sister Dorothy Farley, New York archdiocesan coordinator for radio and television. The benefit raised more than \$500,000 for the Polish Winter Relief Fund.

The fund, which provides food and clothing for the needy in Poland, was one of the last projects initiated by the late Cardinal Terence Cooke of New York.

Bishop Joseph T. O'Keefe, administrator of the New York Archdiocese until Archbishop John J. O'Connor is installed in March, said the film gives people "insights into the pope they normally wouldn't have" and shows the heroism of the pope and the Polish people under the stress of communism.

"It's good, solid dramatic entertainment," he said. "You don't look at it out of duty."

## CM Junior Learns Winter Survival

Darcy Anne Rombough, a Cardinal Mooney junior and member of the Genesee Girl Scout Council was selected to attend the "Go in the Snow" project hosted Feb. 2-14 by Penn Lakes Girl Scout Council, Pennsylvania. According to a news release the event, which was to provide an educational exploration of methods of snow travel and provide personal growth opportunities in relating to others and self-awareness, was held at Camp Hawthorne

Ridge near Erie, PA. Twenty-four girls from throughout the U.S. were selected to participate in the event through which they learned about and experienced such snow travel methods as dog sledding, alpine skiing, nordic skiing, snowshoeing, snowmobiling.
