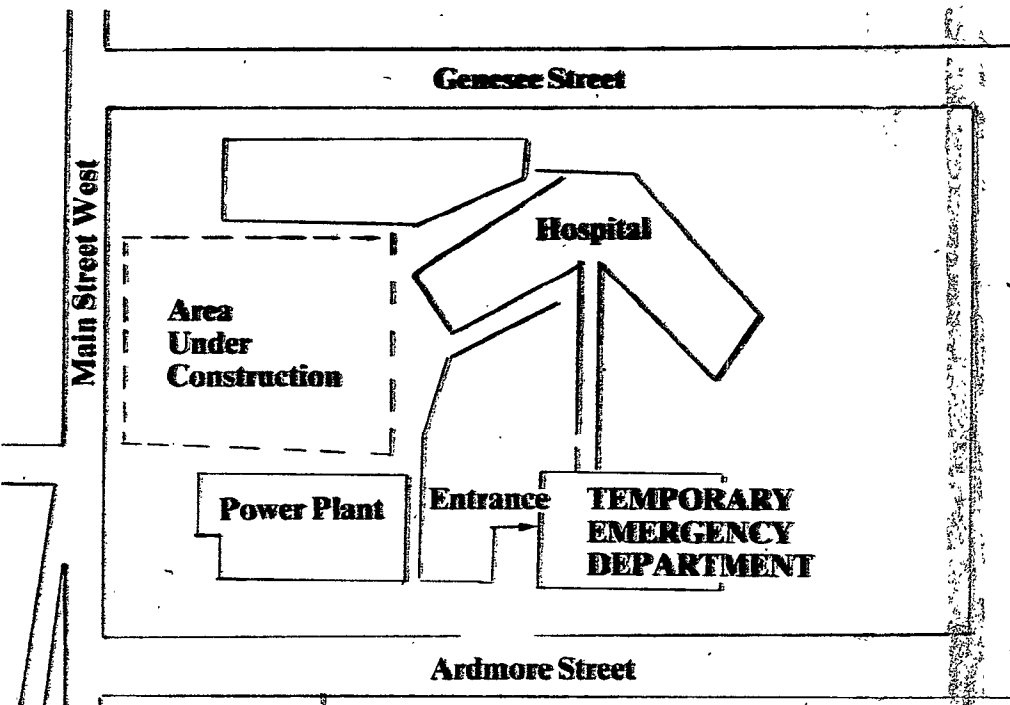

The diocesan Environment and Art Committee is planning a workshop and exhibit focusing on the use of textiles and fabrics in the liturgical space from 9:30 a.m. to noon, Saturday, April 7, at the Mercy High School gym.

Dennis and Nancy Piatkowski of Kenmore will share their expertise in weaving and vestment-making. Sister Estelle Martin, RSM, and Joanne Zawacki will offer practical tips about banner making. Also covered will be the designing of stoles, altar linens, albs and book covers. Fabric selection will be another topic.

Committee will display what it describes as "beautiful and contemporary" vestments and textiles for the liturgy. Work done by Mrs. Mary Gubertlet, Michele Driscoll, John C. Menihan, Sister Kristin Malone, SSJ; Sister Estelle, the Carmelite Sisters and many other artists and seamstresses will be shown.

Camp Fire's Call a Friend program, a telephone service for children has been granted \$3,000 from the Col. William H. Emerson Memorial Fund through the Rochester Area Foundation. This support will enable the Camp Fire Girls and Boys Council to continue the service through which trained adult volunteers act as friendly listeners for children who may be home alone.

Since its beginning in October 1983, the service has handled more than 1,400 calls. Most of the children call about loneliness, boredom or concerns about school or friendships.
