Bishop Clark Honored at K. of C. Banquet

Bishop Matthew H. Clark was honored at the Finger Lakes Chapter of the Knights of Columbus at its annual Bishop's Burse Banquet March 31 in Canandaigua.

The chapter is made up of 26 councils and 12 Fourth Degree assemblies from throughout the 12 counties of the Rochester diocese.

In addition to individual burses presented by various councils and assemblies,

William J. Sassone, KHS, state deputy of the state K. of C. Council, presented a major burse to Bishop Clark on behalf of the state council. Similar burses have been presented to all of the ordinaries in the state.

Earlier in the day, a Third Degree Exemplification took place at the Canandaigua Council home and 84 men received the honors of the

Third Degree in a ceremony named in honor of Bishop Clark.

During his post-banquet remarks, Bishop Clark, a Fourth Degree knight, urged all to continue to study seriously and reflect on the bishops' pastoral, "God's Challenge and Our Response." At the conclusion of his talk, the bishop received a standing ovation from the audience of some 300 Knights, wives and guests.

In his introduction of Bishop Clark, William F. Schmitz, master of ceremonies, quoted from Cardinal Carter's recent Toronto archdiocese pastoral letter on the priesthood, wherein reference is made to the fact that bishops as primary teachers have a right to expect the support of Catholics in upholding the teachings of the Magisterium. On behalf of the 5,000 Knights and their families in the Rochester diocese, Schmitz reaffirmed that commitment of support and loyalty to diocesan priests, Bishop Clark and the Holy Father.
