Concern Over MX Voting Prompts Diocesean Action

Sister Christine Wagner, SSJ, of the diocesan Department of Justice and Peace, last week alerted diocesans that "within the next two weeks a crucial Congressional vote will be held on the MX missile system."

"The proposal calls for \$3.2 billion to build 40 additional missiles," she said; and "Last year Congress approved \$2.5 billion for the first 21 of these weapons."

"The MX has been called 'the most dangerous weapon to date,' and a weapon which makes 'nuclear holocaust much more likely," she said.

She commented, "Last year's expenditure was passed by only a nine-vote margin. With sentiment regarding the MX so drastically

split, now is the most crucial time to influence the 'swing' members in the House for the upcoming vote. Those members of the House who are ambivalent about their stand on MX need to hear from constituents so their vote can be truly representative."

She said, "Congressman Frank Horton has been identified as a 'swing vote'."

She asked diocesans:

"Please take a few minutes to write or call your representative office, especially Rep. Horton. Urge them to vote no for additional MX funding and to rescind monies already appropriated. Your letter is vital and needed now!




