Trappist Constitution Formalizes Lifestyle

Holyoke, Mass. (NC) -- The Trappist order has provisionally adopted a new constitution that formalizes many of the lifestyle changes the group has made over the last 15 years.

The order will live under the new constitution for three years to test the document's application to their daily life before giving it a final vote.

More than 100 members of the contemplative order ended their general chapter at the Mount Marie conference center in Holyoke at the end of May.

They approved a constitution that will produce no radical changes in any of the 89 Trappist monasteries around the world.

The meeting did, however, produce one actual and one potential change in the way the order elects its leadership. Abbey representatives voted to eliminate the position of abbot vicar, traditionally a stepping stone to becoming abbot general, and also indicated they would be willing to allow Trappist nuns to vote for abbot general if that privilege is granted by the Vatican.

Baltimore Gets Black Auxiliary

Washington (NC) -- Bishop Michael J. Begley of Charlotte, N.C., and Auxiliary Bishop T. Austin Murphy of Baltimore announced their retirements May 29 and Pope John Paul II named three new auxiliary bishops, including the first black auxiliary for Baltimore.

Msgr. William C. Newman, 55, rector of the Cathedral of Mary Our Queen in Baltimore, and Josephite Father John H. Ricard, 44, pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish in Washington, were named auxiliary bishops of Baltimore. Bishop-designate Ricard is the 10th black bishop in the United States.

Msgr. John T. Steinbock, 46, rector of St. Vibiana Cathedral in Los Angeles, was named auxiliary bishop of Orange, Calif.

One abbot general presides over both the male Trappist order and the Trappistine nuns.

"What the constitution has done is to embody the experimentation going on in the last 15 years," said Father Placid McSweeney of St. Joseph's Abbey, Spencer, Mass.

In 1969, many Trappist abbeys dropped their traditional rule of absolute silence and also instituted democratic procedures for governing their monasteries. Both of these changes have been included in the new constitution for the Trappists, formally called the Order of Cistercians of the Strict Observance.

Members of the order of Trappist nuns will not be included in elections for abbot general because the practice would be, according to one monk, "canonically impossible."

But chapter representatives did take a non-binding preference vote to indicate their

support for the nuns' right to vote if the Vatican granted them that privilege.

Press reports at the beginning of the chapter meeting had said that the male Trappists were considering a move to let the nuns vote at the chapter itself, but Father McSweeney said those reports were incorrect.

"It's a non-issue. The nuns have their own chapter and they have full authority in their own order. They were present at our chapter because they will have to do their own constitutions; they were not being deprived of anything," he said.

Many of the representatives to the 1984 chapter said they enjoyed coming to the United States for the meeting. The order has made no firm plans, however, about returning to North America for another chapter.

The 1987 meeting will probably be held in Spain, Father McSweeney said.

The meeting began May 11 and drew 89 monks and 25 Trappistines.
