Bishop Appointed For Lithuanians

Washington (NC) -- Pope John Paul II has named U.S. Franciscan Father Paul Baltakis as the first bishop in charge of spiritual assistance to all Lithuanian Catholics outside Lithuania.

The 59-year-old Lithuanian-born priest has been head of U.S. Lithuanian Franciscan vicariate since 1979. The vicariate, which has 32 priests and 13 brothers, has headquarters at St. Anthony Friary in Kennebunkport, Maine.

Bishop-designate Baltakis will take over the work that until now was done by two bishops. They are Bishop Vincent Brizgys, 80, who lives in Chicago and since 1951 has been charged with assistance to Lithuanian Catholics outside Europe, and Bishop Antanis Deksnys, 78, who lives in West Germany and has been in charge of Lithuanian Catholics in Western Europe.

The Lithuanian Catholic Religious Aid Center in New York estimates that there are 2 million people of Lithuanian descent living outside Lithuania, about half of them in the United States. There are 100 Lithuanian national parishes in the United States, it said.

Bishop Brizgys said in an interview that at least 90 percent of expatriate Lithuanians are Catholics, and small minorities are Protestant, Orthodox or Jewish. He said that because of his age he had been consulting "for some time" with the Holy See over a replacement.

Outside the United States, he said, the largest numbers of Lithuanians abroad are in Canada, followed by several Latin American countries and Australia.

He described Bishop-designate Baltakis as an excellent choice who is "very well liked" and "very well known to all Lithuanians."

Paul Baltakis was born Jan. 1, 1925, in Latavenai, Lithuania. He had just applied for seminary studies in 1944 when the Nazis took him into Germany and then Finland for forced labor.

After the war he went to Belgium and was ordained a priest on Aug. 24, 1952, in St. Truiden, Belgium, after studies in seminaries of the Belgian Franciscan Province of St. Joseph.

Shortly after he was ordained he moved to Canada, where he worked for 15 years. In 1959 he came to the United States, working in New York as director of the Lithuanian Cultural Center and spiritual assistant for the Lithuanian youth in the New York area. He was also national spiritual director of the Lithuanian Scouts Organization.
