

New York (NC) -- The Vatican is considering seriously the questions of altar girls and liturgical dance, Archbishop Virgilio Noe, secretary of the Vatican's Congregation for Divine Worship, told New York-area liturgists.

The archbishop met with liturgical commissions of the New York Archdiocese and the dioceses of Brooklyn and Rockville Centre during a stop in New York at the end of his June 5-17 visit to the United States.

The 62-year-old Italian archbishop, who was master of ceremonies to three popes before taking his present job. fielded questions on liturgical problems in this country after giving a brief talk on the need

serving at the altar and said the rule was "a discipline" which is now under study.

He asked the liturgists to "have patience" as the Holy See studies the question of the use of dance in the liturgy. Acceptance of dance

would be "a great change in tradition," he said. The archbishop noted that dance plays a different role in Western cultures than it does in others, such as in Africa, and its use in liturgy would be taken differently in different cultures.

His congregation is currently studying the question in depth, he said, and eventually "the decision will be taken at the consideration of the Holy Father."
