Hospital Adds Equipment

Hornell -- New equipment, the Cybex II with computer and the Orthotron II are being used in the physical therapy department of St.

James Mercy Hospital. According to Richard Bondi, department director, the new units will enhance the quality of physical therapy programs.

by measuring each muscle group, power and endurance. Each limb is measured by itself and in comparison with the other and each muscle group is checked for stability imbalance.

The Cybex can measure the availability of muscle output from a very fast constant speed down to zero speed. It provides measurements needed to identify performance and deficiencies, determines the extent of injury and disability and evaluates rehabilitation goals and processes. It also provides assistance to the physician to determine the best course of rehabilitation before or after surgery.

The information is interpreted by the data reduction computer in relation to stresses placed on the body during competition and training. The printout profiles each athlete, complete with weaknesses, strengths, endurance, flexibility and power.

The Orthotron II makes it possible to exercise athletes as well as weak-acute patients in shoulder, hip, knee and ankle patterns. High and low pressure gauges provide feedback to the patient and therapist.

With the Cybex II, isometric as well as isokinetic exercises are possible and measurable by computer readout. The testing can help training goals specific to an athlete's needs or the demands of a particular sport

Work Begun To Canonize Cdl. Cooke

New York (NC) -- An organization to work for the canonization of the late Cardinal Terence Cooke already had "hundreds" of members when it was launched officially on the first anniversary of his death Oct. 6, according to the priest appointed by Archbishop John J. O'Connor as postulator of the cause.

Capuchin Father Benedict J. Groeschel, who is also spiritual development director of the New York archdiocese, said members of the Cardinal Cooke Guild included many Jews and other non-Catholics.

Since the anniversary of Cardinal Cooke's death fell on a Saturday, the anniversary Mass at St. Patrick's Cathedral was moved to Oct. 5 so that commuters who work in the city might attend.

Archbishop O'Connor was principal celebrant of the Mass, and among those concelebrating were several bishops and priests who had been closely associated with Cardinal Cooke.

Sudan Rebels Free Skaneateles Priest

Rome (NC) -- An American missionary and two other priests kidnapped Sept. 4 in southern Sudan have been released unharmed, a missionary official in Rome said Oct. 23.

The three, including Mill Hill Father Peter Curtin Major, 45, of Skaneateles, N.Y., were freed Oct. 19, said Father Heinrich Pallhuber, procurator general of the Mill Hill order. Father Pallhuber said that as

far as he knew a ransom had not been paid to the abductors, believed to be Sudanese guerrillas.

The other priests kidnapped along with Father Major were Mill Hill Father John Ashworth of Great Britain and Father Zakariah Chatin, a Sudanese diocesan priest. Father Pallhuber said the two missionaries were in Khartoum, and were expected to return to their home countries soon.

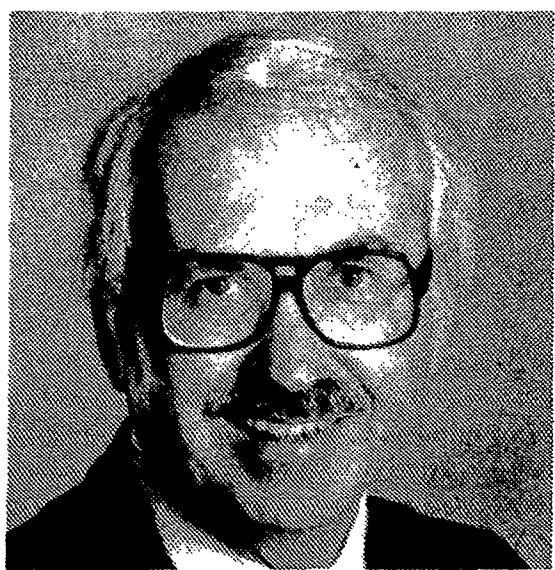
