

# Urgent Action Sets Writers Conference

The Inter-Religious Urgent Action Network in Rochester will meet 9 a.m.-12:30 p.m., Saturday, Dec. 1 at St. John the Evangelist Parish center on Humboldt Street.

The event is sponsored by the Human Rights Task Force of the diocesan International Justice and Peace Commission.

Urgent Action is a part of Amnesty International.

A feature of the program will be an address by Father Ed Dillon, chaplain of Monroe County Jail and minister to homeless and indigent persons.

An ecumenical prayer service will also be held.

The event is being billed as "an opportunity to expand your awareness of Amnesty International and to meet other groups in our area that share your interest in the Urgent Action Network."

"As our Advent is filled with the expectations of Christmas and the birth of the Prince of Peace," promotional literature states, "let us all set aside a few hours one day as a time of prayer and action on behalf of those prisoners whose Advent will be filled with sickness, imprisonment, torture and possible execution."
