Fairport --- Parishioners of the Church of the Assumpon and diocesan readers were alerted last week to a "good tory" lodged in the church sanctuary. An item in the parish bulletin stated:

"For over a year we've been grappling with the problem of a counterweight for our sanctuary lamp.

That's a device whereby the lamp, hanging high up in the arch, can be lowered in order to replace the candle each week.

"Church catalogues listed the price of one such counterweight as \$475.

"Our maintenance department (one Dick Frude) devised and put in place, with the help of a length of cable, a couple of pulleys and a pair of bricks from our old church, a very effective counterweight for the total price of \$11.96 and a half an hour time to install."

"That's quite an answer to those \$1,000 hammers and 5400 toilet seats in the Defense Department's budget," the author remarked.


