More than 100 volunteers assisted in the collection of funds. According to Wilmot, 61% of the total was donated by individuals, 22% by corporations, 16% by foundations, and service organizations gave the rest.

The School of the Holy Childhood is a nondenominational, non-profit agency that educates and trains mentally retarded children and adults.

The Children's Program has an enrollment of 102 between the ages of 5 and 21. Instructions include reading, writing, math and prevocational skills -- woodworking, cooking, sewing, independent living skills training and adapted physical education.

The Adult Day Training Program serves 45 mentally retarded adults 18 or older. It operates on a year-round vocational programs, longterm sheltered employment or selected job placement.

A Clinic Treatment Program offers medical services. speech therapy and mental

basis, preparing clients for health services which supplement the education and training offered by the other programs. Clinic services not offered are provided through referral to other community agencies.
