Growing Hamlin Parish Launches Building Campaign for New Church

Father William J. Amann, pastor of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton parish, and the parish council recently announced that the parish has launched a fund-raising campaign to raise \$500,000 to build a new church. The parish, established by Bishop Matthew H. Clark in 1982, is currently using four buildings — including a converted railroad depot as its church — for various parish functions.


The church will be built on the parish's property on the southeast corner of Brick School House Road and West Fork, Hamlin.

Bishop Clark has given his endorsement to the intensive fund-raising campaign which

will be conducted during an eight-week period. Memorials will be utilized throughout the campaign. They will not only raise substantial amounts of money, but are also expected to unite donors in a more permanent remembrance with St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish through a lasting recognition of their generosity. A special memorial plaque will be erected in a public area in the new church.

For the next four years, Kacprzak followed his father's and grandfather's footsteps, working for the Robert Hart Printing Company, and helping to support his family after his father suffered a disabl-

When the Hart Company closed, he entered St. John Fisher College, graduating

From St. Bernard's Seminary, where he studied from 1980-81, Kacprzak transferred to Rome, where he received a bachelor's degree in sacred theology from Gregorian University and a master's degree in theology from the University of St. Thomas Aquinas. During the past year, Kacprzak has served as a deacon at St. Margaret Mary.

Shirley Kacprzak recalled that when her son told her and his father of his intention to attend college in preparation for the priesthood, he said "if it's God's will, I'll make it."
