## 'Shadowing' at Nazareth

Nazareth Academy students have had the opportunity this year of seeing what life is really like in various business fields. Ann Kelly, a member of Nazareth's Board of Governors and the mother of a graduate now attending Georgetown University, organized and conducted a "shadowing program" for Nazareth seniors.

"I feel that students ought to know what they're getting into," Kelly explained. "Often, they think they want to get into a certain career and don't really know the day-to-day aspects of that career."

So, Kelly has matched students interested in various career fields with persons actually working in those fields. As a result, students have "shadowed" travel agents, florists, computer operators and lawyers, to name a few.

Said one student, after a day with a travel agent: "I thought being a travel agent was glamorous; I see now that there are more hours spent behind a desk than in glamorous places." Another student commented: "I'm so glad I shadowed a computer programmer; now I know it's what I want to do."

Kelly says she feels the program has been a success and that she has learned quite a bit about various careers, too.

## School Bids Farewell To Volunteer Art Teacher

Sheila Prinzing, a volunteer art teacher at Holy Trinity for the past 14 years, is leaving the school to pursue a degree in art education at Nazareth College.

Prinzing first gained an interest in art while taking two undergraduate courses in art history, and later taught second grade in the Webster Central School District where she realized that she wanted to be an art teacher. She began team teaching at the primary level with local artist Jeanne VanApeldorn, but eventually went out on her own. Seven years ago, she began teaching in grades four to eight.

Prinzing has mixed feelings about leaving Holy Trinity. "I can find these kids, and I believe in them," she says. She discovered through 14 years of experience that often a child who lacks a positive self-concept in other areas of his life can develop a feeling of self-worth through artistic expression. She is opposed to the notion of allowing one student to become the "class artist," and her goal has always been that every child should feel that there is something good about his art.

Nancy Lattanzio, a representative from Holy Trinity, notes that Prinzing has touched the lives of children, teachers, and parents at the school, all of whom will sorely miss her. "We wish her the best of luck in her academic endeavors and look forward to her return to parochial school education," Lattanzio said.
