Activities Around the Diocese

Hispanic Conference

Diocesan directors from 20 Hispanic Apostolates in the northeast U.S. met late last month in New York City for a two-day conference. Talks by cardinals O'Connor and Law, review of proposals from the region for the upcoming national encuentro in Washington, and celebration of the recent naming of Bishop-elect Alvaro Corrada del Rio, S.J. were included in the program.

The host, Cardinal O'Connor, spoke to diocesan directors about his trip to Central America earlier this year. Cardinal Law discussed a recent trip to Cuba. Both expressed optimism for the future of the Church in the countries they visited in light of continuing dialogue, but noted some very difficult problems that persist.

Following the talks, directors and more than 100 guests celebrated Mass at the Catholic Center on First Avenue in New York, with Bishop-designate Alvaro Corrada del Rio, the first Puerto Rican bishop for the continental U.S., as principal celebrant.

The recommendations presented by directors were received from a regional encuentro held in Philadelphia in early June. More services for ex-offenders, single mothers, problem youth, undocumented aliens and marginal members of the Church and society were cited as needing more attention. Requests for parish workers for vouth and diocesan offices for Hispanic youth were also presented.

The new monsignor was a member of Our Lady of Good Counsel Church in Rochester, where his parents, Elizabeth and the late William Kraft, were founding members. Graduating from Nazareth Hall Academy, Aquinas Institute and St. Andrew's Semimary in Rochester, he attended St. Bernard's College, where he earned a bachelor of arts degree in 1945. Transferring to Immaculate Heart Seminary of the University of San Diego, he continued his studies and was ordained a priest in 1951.

Prior to his current assignment, Monsignor Kraft founded St. Therese of the Child Jesus and Good Shepherd parishes in San Diego, and served as director of cemeteries. In 1981, he earned a doctor of ministry degree from the School of Theology at Claremont, Calif., and was invested as a priest-knight of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem in April, 1984.

Brother David (James Valentine) Concannon, received a doctor of education degree from Fordham University this past May, and has been appointed the new principal of Rice High School in Harlem.

The son of the late James P. Concannon and Helen O'Sullivan Concannon, he was born in Bronx, N.Y., and enrolled in the Irish Christian Brothers preparatory school at West Park, N.Y. in his second year of high school, studying at St. Joseph's Juniorate. He earned a bachelor's degree in history from Iona College in June, 1956, and began a 33-year teaching career at St. Patrick's Hall School in St. John's, Newfoundland.

Prior to his assignment in Rochester, Brother Concannon's assignments included teaching at Essex Catholic High School in Newark, N.J., Bishop Farrell High School in Staten Island, Cardinal Farley Military Academy in Rhinecliff, N.Y., and Power Memorial Academy in Manhattan.

While teaching full time, Brother Concannon earned a master's degrees in theology from St. John's University in Queens in 1962, in Spanish education from Richmond College (CUNY) in Staten Island in 1971, and in urban education from Fordham University at Lincoln Center in 1978.



Trustee Emeritus Speaks At Nazareth

E. James Hickey, Nazareth College trustee emeritus and attorney-of-counsel for Harter, Secrest & Emery, will be featured at the 11th Annual Alice L. Foley Lecture on Wednesday, July 17, at 10 a.m. Hickey will discuss the importance of lifelong learning for teachers in his address entitled "Teacher. Doesn't It Matter To You That We Are Going To Drown?'

Hickey, who joined the college's board of trustees in 1964, was named trustee emeritus in 1981 after serving as secretary of the board from 1969-80. A graduate of Georgetown University and the Yale Law School, his law career has spanned more than 40 years.

The lecture series, initiated in 1975, honors Dr. Foley's contribution to education over many years, including her presidency of Nazareth from 1972-76. She also served as the college's director of continuing education after many years of teaching at elementary, secondary and college levels. The lecture will be held in the Forum of the Otto A.
