Junior Katy Klenk and Nora Senecal, a senior, began the chapter because, in Senecal's words, "students ought to know that there are other students who do not approve of or condone drinking and driving." The two conducted an assembly featuring Steve Casper, a quadraplegic confined to a wheelchair after a drunk-driving incident.

"My message to you is don't think it can never happen to you," Casper said, describing how drinking and driving were part of his life during high school. "If I hadn't gotten into the accident, I'd still be drinking and driving. Some of my friends still are."

The program continued with a question-and-answer session and a graphic slide show with pictures from the office of the Monroe County Medical Examiner. Afterward, students were able to register as SADD members while cards with the names and phone numbers of teachers were distributed at the junior prom and senior ball. Klenk explained that, if a student found herself in the car with a drunken driver, she could call a teacher for a ride home.
