St. Peter's Kitchen runs out of steam, seeks volunteers

Imagine four or five volunteers serving lunch to as many as 460 people. That's been a reality at St. Peter's Kitchen on West Main Street this summer.

Meanwhile the kitchen, which serves lunch from noon to 2 p.m. Monday through Saturday for an average of about 250 people,

is facing winter's approach without heat.

Brother Walter deCremieux, the new coordinator of the three-year-old program, is concerned that he and his co-workers can't continue their ministry without additional help, both financial and volunteer.

Funds are needed to overhaul the Ss. Peter and Paul school building's boilers if the kitchen is to remain at its present location. An attic sale held this past Saturday and Sunday was one way the kitchen's organizers hoped to combat their financial distress. But the work involved in fund raisers further drains the already-overworked corps of

volunteers.

Brother Walter has noticed a slight decline in his pool of almost 500 volunteers and attributes the loss to burnout, pure and simple. "I don't find fault with the people who have been so committed to our work here, but people do get tired ... It's a difficult ministry and you can only squeeze so much blood from a stone," he observed.

"We emphasize being servants and welcoming to people," Brother Walter added, but that kind of personalism is nearly impossible to maintain with a ratio as high as
