

Action Center Grant

The Easter Seals Society has awarded \$15,000 to Catholic Charities' Action Center for the Disabled, a social and recreational program for disabled adults.

In a letter announcing the grant, Easter Seals' President John E. Swett stated: "this is the first time that we have granted the entire amount of the request in a second year of support to an agency and that we have given as much as \$15,000 ... We congratulate you on the unique service which the Action Center provides to the handicapped adults of Monroe County.'

The Action Center is the only purely recreational program open to adults with a variety of handicaps, from hearing or visual
