

Bishop Clark administers ceremony advancing local seminary students

Three young men studying for ordination to the priesthood in the Diocese of Rochester recently received the Rite of Candidacy from Bishop Matthew H. Clark.

Michael McHale, Paul Bonacci and Timothy Brown are third-year theology students at the Immaculate Conception Seminary on the Campus of Seton Hall University in South Orange, N.J.

Father Richard Liddy, rector of the Seminary, invited Bishop Clark to administer the Rite of Candidacy to the three Rochesterians and to eight members of the third theology class at the seminary who are studying for ordination in other dioceses.

The Rite of Candidacy is a step in the process of study for the priesthood in which the seminarian publicly declares before a bishop his desire to be ordained a priest.

McHale, Bonacci, Brown and their classmates during the celebration of the Eucharist at the New Jersey Seminary on January 30th.

McHale is the son of Alice McHale of Corning and the late Frank McHale. He and his mother attend St. Mary's parish in that community.

Bonacci is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Bonacci of Waterloo. They are members of St. Mary's parish there.

Brown is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Brown of Rochester. They are members of St. Pius X parish in Chili. Brown's younger brother, Michael, is also studying for ordination to the priesthood for the Diocese of Rochester. He is in his second year of theological studies at the New Jersey seminary.

Love the Children, a licensed non-profit adoption agency, will hold a general informational meeting on April 3, at the Fairport Public Library at 7 p.m. The program places Korean children between the ages of six months and 14 years into caring homes. Applicants must be couples married for three years, while one parent must be willing to stay home with the child until he or she is 24 months old. The process takes approximately six months from the application time to the arrival of the child. The children are in good health and are cared for in foster homes in Korea.
