

## Mr. Thomas Rosica to become Basilian priest in April 19 ordination Mass at St. Ambrose

Thomas Michael Rosica, CSB, son of Dr. and Mrs. Anthony Rosica of St. Ambrose Parish, will be ordained to the priesthood in the Congregation of St. Basil on Saturday, April 19. Bishop Matthew H. Clark will preside at the ceremony at St. Ambrose Church, 25 Empire Blvd., Rochester, at 11 a.m. Rosica will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving at 9:30 a.m. at St. Ambrose the following morning.

Deacon Rosica attended Nazareth Hall and St. Ambrose Elementary schools before moving on to Aquinas Institute, from which he was graduated in June, 1977. Later that year, Rosica also entered the Basilian Fathers Formation program. He received a bachelor of arts degree in French and secondary education from St. John Fisher College in May, 1980.

During his high school and college years, he worked in the nursing department at St. Ann's Home for the Aged. He was also appointed by Bishop Joseph L. Hogan and later by Bishop Clark to serve as youth representative on the Diocesan Pastoral Council, a term he held for three years, including one year on the DPC's Executive Committee.

After graduating from Fisher in 1980, he spent the ensuing summers studying in France, after receiving the Lions Clubs Centres Culturels Scholarship to study French language and culture. He spent four months working at the International Headquarters of the Centres Culturels de France in Paris, where he helped set up a scholarship program for students from Catholic schools in North America. Shortly after his work at the Paris headquarters, Rosica became the

first North American to be appointed to the board of directors of the Centres Culturels, a position he held for four years.

He spent the 1980-81 school year teaching at the College du Sacre-Coeur, the Basilian foundation in southern France. After returning to the United States the following year, Rosica moved to Toronto, and for three years he studied theology at Regis College in the University of Toronto School of Theology. While studying theology, he did his field-education study at the Canadian Center for Ecumenism in Montreal during the summer of 1984.

Deacon Rosica made his final profession of vows as a Basilian in September, 1985, and was ordained to the diaconate on September 7, 1985, by Cardinal George Flahiff, CSB, in Toronto. For the past year, he has served at St. John the Baptist Parish

in Amherstburg, Ontario. He will remain in the parish for another year before pursuing graduate studies in sacred scripture.

Deacon Rosica is the eldest of six children. His parents live at 75 Highview Dr., East Irondequoit.

## Mr. Gary Tyman to be ordained to priesthood in April 11 ceremony at Good Shepherd Church

Bishop Matthew H. Clark will ordain Gary Tyman a priest of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Rochester at an ordination Mass on Friday evening, April 11, at 7:30 p.m. at the Church of the Good Shepherd, 3264 E. Henrietta Rd., Rochester.

The Rosary and Altar Society of the parish will host a reception in the school gymnasium after the ordination. Tyman will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving on Sunday, April 13, at 11:30 a.m. also at Good Shepherd. He will also celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving on Saturday evening, April 19, at 5:30 p.m., in his home parish of St. Francis of Assisi, 22 Church St., Phelps.

Tyman, the son of Ray and Betty Tyman of Phelps, was born on December 1, 1950 in Clifton Springs. He attended Phelps High School, and soon after became active in various activities in St. Francis Parish. After graduating in 1968, Deacon Tyman moved on to St. Bonaventure University where he attained a bachelor of arts degree in 1972. He enrolled in the Cornell University Law School, from which he received a doctorate in law in 1975.

He was admitted to practice law in New York State in February, 1976, and became a member of the Ontario County Bar Association. He practiced law in Phelps from 1976-81 with John C. Britting, Esq.

During his law partnership, he became involved in the Cursillo Movement in the Rochester Diocese from 1977-81.

He enrolled in the St. John's International School, Waterloo, Belgium, in 1982-83 and

joined the Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe, from 1983-85 in Mons, Belgium.

During the Summer of 1983, Tyman joined the Clinical Pastoral Education at St. Peter's Hospital in Albany. He became deacon of the Church of the Good Shepherd in the summer of 1984.

He received his master of arts in religious studies from the Catholic University of Louvain, Belgium in 1985, and is currently serving as deacon-intern at Good Shepherd.

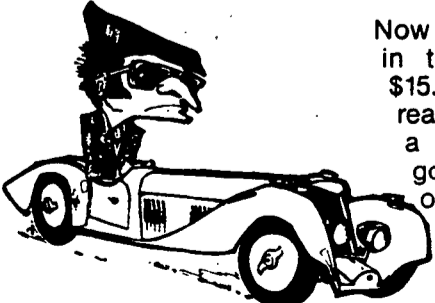
