School plans drug, alcohol awareness week

Holy Ghost, Rochester — Drug and Alcohol Awareness Week will be held at the Holy Ghost School from April 24-30. The school will be participating in an extensive program of daily activities in an effort to educate students on the dangers of abusing drugs and alcohol.

On Thursday, April 24 at 7:30 p.m. in the school hall, the Home-School Association, in conjunction with G-C Radar and the Heuther-Doyle Memorial Institute, will present a film, "Wasted," for all the parents in the parish. Following the film, parents will hear the stories of two teens recovering from addiction to drugs and also the mother of a reformed drug abuser.

A similar program will be presented during the week to the seventh and eighth grade students at the school.

The film, "Alcohol Use vs. Abuse," will be presented to the fifth and sixth grades by Lou Ferrari of the Monroe County Sheriffs Department. Time for a discussion period will follow.


After the week-long series of films and presentations concerning drug abuse, the program will culminate on Wednesday evening, April 30, with a dance in the school hall for the sixth, seventh and eighth grade students within the parish. A student from R.I.T. will entertain all on hand with an elaborate sound system and record collection stressing the message that "you can have a good time without drugs and alcohol.'

St. Charles Borromeo, Greece - On Sunday afternoon, April 20, more than 250 volunteers will participate in a census to bring parish records up to date. The census, which will hopefully be completed in four hours or less, will encompass an area of more than 20,000 inhabitants. As of June 1983, 2,570 families were registered as members of St. Charles Borromeo, which recently celebrated its 60th anniversary in Rochester. The church runs the largest parochial school in the diocese, with a current enrollment of 760 pupils, from kindergarten through eighth grade.
