

Man who helped churches names diocese beneficiary

A former railroad worker whose hobby was purchasing stocks has left the seminaries of the diocese a bequest of \$400,000.

Earl J. Fromm, a Jay Street resident and parishioner at Holy Family Church, who died August 14, 1984, left the money to be divided by Bishop Matthew H. Clark among the diocesan seminaries. He also named several other church institutions as beneficiaries, including his parish, the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, St. Joseph's Villa and the School of the Holy Childhood.

"You'd never know he had a penny," said Warren King, an associate of Mr. Fromm's who later became his stockbroker. "He was a great fellow. He always worked hard ... and I often wondered why he wanted to watch the stock market."

After retiring from the railroad, Mr. Fromm worked with King at a local brokerage firm, where he recorded stock quotations by hand on a large blackboard before the days of sophisticated electronic-posting systems.

Even after retiring from the brokerage in the late 1960s, Mr. Fromm continued to spend his time investing and reinvesting his money. "He came downtown every day as long as he could," King said.

Mr. Fromm's parents ran a meat market

on Campbell Street where their son got his start, according to Father Frederick Eisemann, pastor of Holy Family Church.

"Basically, he hit the stock market pretty well," Father Eisemann said. "He would go to churches that had needs and help them. He was very generous to a lot of churches ... and he was at church a lot."

"I think he found life rather lonely of late," Father Eisemann added. Mr. Fromm never married and was survived by a cousin, Hilda Kraus.

In accordance with Mr. Fromm's will, Bishop Clark has announced that St. Bernard's Institute — the Roman Catholic graduate school of theology and ministry affiliated with Colgate Rochester Divinity School/Bexley Hall/Crozer Theological Seminary — and Becket Hall, the headquarters of the diocesan priestly formation program, will each receive approximately \$200,000.

"The generosity of the late Earl J. Fromm is deeply appreciated," Bishop Clark said in acknowledgement. "The money which Mr. Fromm so graciously bequeathed to the Diocese of Rochester will greatly help St. Bernard's Institute and Becket Hall in carrying out their very important mission for the church of Rochester."

At St. Bernard's, the bequest will be

placed in the endowment fund. "The board is profoundly grateful to the late Mr. E.J. Fromm," said Dr. Mary Sullivan, chairwoman of the institute's trustees. "His generosity will greatly strengthen St. Bernard's ability to provide graduate theological and ministerial education to countless laymen and laywomen who are called to minister in the Church."

Father James Schwartz, Becket Hall's director, said: "The importance of formation for ministry is expanding dramatically in the Church and is presenting an ever-greater challenge to us. The generosity of Mr. Fromm will provide us with valuable resources to meet this challenge."

CRS sends milk to Poland
