Catholic Family Center's STAR Program has chosen Layton Northrup as its Volunteer of the Month for July.

Northrup, 87, is described by staff as "the most positive man alive ... one who brings cheer wherever he goes."

Elmira native Father Bartholomew McMahon, OFM, is serving as chaplain at a Japanese medium security prison in Maebashi.

The prison has a population of nearly 800 second- and third-time offenders serving sentences of one to one-and-a-half years for drug related charges. During weekly visits, Father McMahon conducts classes in scripture and English for the inmates, who are allowed private interviews with the chaplain once each month.

A Franciscan priest since 1962, Father McMahon found his ministry eight years ago during language classes. "A young friend of mine got into trouble and spent the next year-and-a-half in prison," he said. "But then he changed, and now he is doing well as president of his own company."

Nazareth Academy senior Lora Wise and 22 other students will take advantage of a new work-study program this fall.

Introduced by the school's business department, the program will offer practical work experience in addition to classroom learning. Students will apply for jobs with Rochester-area banks and corporations. They will then attend classes in the morning, and will be dismissed for work at 1 p.m. each day.

"We have recognized for a long time that the ideal way to prepare for a particular job is to work at that job," said Rose Umiker, head of the business department.

Eventually, organizers hope to involve all the school's business students in work-study.
