Byrne agreed that the parish shelters should not close unless another alternative is created. "We've been so involved for so long now that we can't just let it drop," he said. "But we need new faces and new energies. What would be the harm of changing locations and giving new organizations and people a chance to take over a shelter?"

"We opened as a temporary Band-Aid solution to the situation, and it's time for others to grow off of us," he added.

All three parish shelters welcome volunteers, donation and prayers. The network is also seeking the tax-deductible donation of a car to transport meals and guests between shelters.

Respite Cares! is an interfaith service that offers relief to families with disabled children or adult members. Volunteers are recruited from local congregations to provide a break for the families.

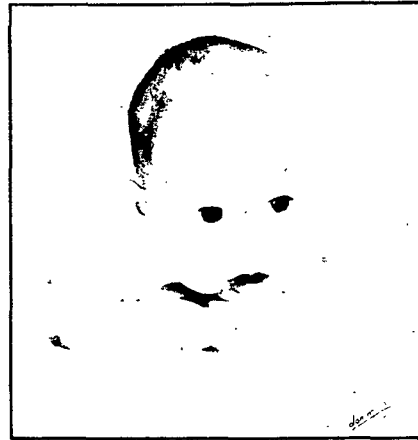
