A Pittsburgh native, Brother Nathan Munsch made his final profession as a Benedictine monk of Mount Saviour Monastery near Elmira August 9.

Prior Martin Boler, OSB, the superior of Mt. Saviour, received Brother Munsch's profession in the monastery chapel before nearly 100 relatives and friends. Bishop William G. Connare of the Diocese of Greensburgh, Pa., also participated in the ceremony.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Munsch of Glenshaw, Pa., Brother Munsch earned a bachelor's degree in history from the University of Notre Dame in 1973. He became interested in the Benedictine order in 1971 while studying in France. The following year, he made an extended visit to Mt. Saviour with several other students as part of the Notre Dame Program for the Study of Non-violence.

In 1974, Brother Nathan worked in a South Bend, Ind., hospital and lived in a lay religious community. Two years later, he earned a master's degree in classical languages from Duquesne University.

From 1976 to 1979, he taught high school, then traveled in the Middle East and Europe before entering the monastery in 1980.

Brother Nathan has since served as librarian, translator, wood cutter, cook and part-time farmer. He has also continued classical language studies at Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C.
