The Ancient Order of Hibernians has awarded certificates of merit to three Rochesterians who supported passage of the Northern Ireland Investment Bill.

Honored were **Brother Patrick J. Flanagan, SJ**, assistant to the president of McQuaid Jesuit High School, and State Senators **John Perry** and **Ralph Quattrociochi**, who sponsored and supported the bill.

During the 1970s, Brother Flanagan lived and worked with families in Belfast. Since his return to the U.S., he has continued to work for justice and peace in the strife-torn area.

Signed into law last June by Governor Mario Cuomo, the Northern Ireland Investment Bill requires American firms which receive state pension investment funds and which operate in the six counties of northeast Ireland to comply with hiring practices and fair employment standards known as the McBride Principles. They are named for **Dr. Sean McBride**, who won the Nobel Peace Prize for his international human rights activities.

Virginia Day has been named as vice president of patient care at St. Mary's Health Care Services.

Formerly senior clinical manager at Presbyterian Hospital/Columbia Presbyterian Medical Center in New York City, Day will be responsible for administration and operation of all patient care units.

A graduate of St. Vincent's Hospital School of Nursing in Bridgeport, Conn., she has earned a bachelor's degree in nursing from Boston College and a master of science degree from Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio.

A Cardinal Mooney teacher won the bantamweight title at a national bodybuilding contest last month in Atlanta, Ga. **Paul D'Accursio**, co-owner of The Gym, Inc., in Fairport, finished ahead of 20 other contestants from around the country in categories

which included muscularity, symmetry and individual posing.

D'Accursio qualified for the national contest by finishing second in the bantamweight division last June at the Junior Nationals in Niagara Falls, N.Y. Now he must decide whether to remain an amateur or turn professional and compete in the Mr. Universe contest scheduled later this year in Japan.

Because of his duties at the Cardinal Mooney and The Gym, D'Accursio relied on early morning and late-night training sessions to produce a bodyweight of 139 pounds and 4.5 percent bodyfat. He also attributes his success to support from his wife, Debbie, his family and friends, and most of all, from the Lord.
