The Ancient Order of Hibernians has awarded certificates of merit to three Rochesterians who supported passage of the Northern Ireland Investment Bill.

Honored were Brother Patrick J. Flanagan, SJ, assistant to the president of McQuaid Jesuit High School, and State Senators John Perry and Ralph Quattrociocchi, who sponsored and supported the bill.

During the 1970s, Brother Flanagan lived and worked with families in Belfast. Since his return to the U.S., he has continued to work for justice and peace in the strife-torn area.

Signed into law last June by Governor Mario Cuomo, the Northern Ireland Investment Bill requires American firms which receive state pension investment funds and which operate in the six counties of northeast Ireland to comply with hiring practices and fair employment standards known as the McBride Principles. They are named for Dr. Sean McBride, who won the Nobel Peace Prize for his international human rights activities.
