

Obituary

Varden Studios partner, Paul McGuire, at 80

Paul A. McGuire, a pioneer in the development of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, Brighton, and a leader of diocesan joint high school and college fund drives, died on November 20, 1986, at the age of 80.

Mr. McGuire was born in Chicago of very poor parents and began working early in life as a photo salesman. Through the support of a pastor in Minneapolis, he began specializing in comprehensive photographic coverage of marriages. In the late 1920s, he formed a partnership with Irving A. Stern in Sioux City, Iowa. The partners moved to Rochester in the early 30s, and established Varden Studios.

Mr. McGuire was the quasi-official diocesan photographer for many years, photographing events from high school graduations to the consecration installation of bishops. The official photos of the bishops of Rochester from 1937-1978, which can be found in almost every parish of the diocese, were prepared under Mr. McGuire's direction.

Mr. McGuire's wife of 56 years predeceased him by four months. He is survived by three daughters, Nan McGuire, San Francisco; Cheryl Hearty, Penfield; Elizabeth McGuire, Rochester; and Sister Mary Maxine, St. Paul, Minnesota. A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated in Our Lady of Lourdes on November 24, 1986.

The two dozen retreatants cut across denominational lines, representing a broad cross-section of peace-making activities, said the Episcopal minister. "We had Episcopalians, Roman Catholics and Presbyterians. Some individuals have been very involved demonstrating at Seneca Army Depot; others write letters from their home base and raise their children to cherish peace.

"Some were on the growing edge. They said, 'This is something I've struggled with

for a very long time. I need to do something about peace in my own life. Maybe the time is now."

"Others came because they've known Dan before and have been very inspired by his Bible studies and teaching," she continued. "I am one of those."

The retreat included both individual and group Bible study and ample time for reflection. At the end of the retreat, said Keeney-Mulligan, one retreatant echoed the group's feeling, saying to Berrigan, "You've come to us not as a hero, but as a brother and friend, who has listened to us and shared with us."

74 Ms. C. is an unmarried, pregnant 20-year-old woman. She is unemployed, has no health insurance and has received no financial support from the father of the child. Ms. C. needs help to pay medical bills.

75 B. has a physical disability which makes it impossible for her to care for her three preschool children during the day or to hold a job. Her husband is working full-time, but they are having difficulty paying for day care for their children. They have exhausted all public monies available to them and are now looking for private donations to help.

72 P. is a 19-year-old single parent of three children ages four, two and newborn. She is struggling to be independent and self-supporting. In addition to being a housekeeper and mother, she is studying at home to qualify for the GED. P. only asks for supplemental help in dire emergencies. Sometimes, she finds her struggle to be a lonely one.

73 Mr. and Mrs. L. are absolutely destitute, living on welfare. Mr. L., age 64, is disabled by heart and lung condition. There are four children in the family, one of whom is awaiting trial at the present time on charges of arson. The parents and three other children—ages 20, 15 and 11—are devastated by this tragedy.
