A collection of facts about Christmas carols:

1) Some of the early Christmas carols were composed like folk songs. They retold the Nativity story in many verses.

2) In the Middle Ages, carols were performed as part of miracle plays that took place outside of Gothic cathedrals. They were also sung in processions accompanied by drum and tambourine music. The use of handbells also became a popular tradition.

3) The mummers in England performed carols in an elaborate fashion through the use of masks and costumes.

4) Carols were banned by the Puritans in England and Scotland in the 16th century. They didn't come back into fashion again until the Restoration in 1660.

5) Most of the carols popular today have been translated from foreign languages. Since Latin was once the official language of all of Christendom, most of the familiar medieval hymns begin with Latin lines.

6) Carols are called noels in France and Weinachtslieder in Germany. "Silent Night" was originally written in German. "O Come, All Ye Faithful" is of Latin origin. "Away in a Manger" was written anonymously.

7) "We Three Kings of Orient Are," one of the earliest American carols, was written in
