After months of discussion, the council narrowed the scope of its response to the document to three areas — the relationship between the Church and the world, the roles of laity and clergy/religious, and tensions between the Church and modern culture.

For the past several weekends, parish council members have asked parishioners at St. Paul's to contribute their thoughts on those areas via surveys distributed at each Mass.

Within the next several weeks, the parish council plans to assimilate parishioners' responses into a single letter. Copies of the letter will be sent to Vatican officials as well as to the American Catholic Lay Network and the National Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on the Laity.

Council members chose to respond as a parish rather than as individuals on the theory that, in John Hart's words, "a silver bullet would be more effective than a shotgun.'

Judging by the lack of response to letters they have sent to Vatican officials in the past, the Harts realized that they and fellow council members may never know whether their views have been heard or whether their efforts will bear fruit.

"We're not hopeful that anyone's going to say, 'Hey, come on over and let's talk about this," John Hart said. "But you would like to at least know it's been received. It's very frustrating, because I'm sure all of our input on the synod will go into a black box and never come back out.'

As for the synod's outcome, the Harts hope that the direction established by the Lineamenta is completely reversed in the Instrumentum Laboris, or working document, due to be issued next month.

"This (document) is the worst-case scenario," John Hart concluded. "Any modification from that is an improvement."
