Two Chilean women were received into the congregation of the Sisters of Mercy at their mission in Santiago last month. Lia Gonzalez, 36, and Maria Elena Prado, 28, have joined Sister Soledad Cantillana Calderon as novices in formation.

All three women will be guided during their canonical novitiate year by Sister Kay Schwenzer, a Mercy Sister from Rochester.

The mission community in Santiago now comprises a total of 15 women: the three Chilean novices; six Mercy sisters from Rochester; two Mercy sisters from Australia; two sisters from New Zealand; one from Brooklyn and one from Detroit.

Sister Jean Marie Kears, major superior of the Sisters of Mercy of Rochester, was among 12 religious who participated in the first National Ecumenical Consultation of Men and Women Religious in February at the New Skete Monastery in Cambridge, N.Y.

Sister Kears was one of two representatives from the Leadership Conference of Women Religious. In addition to Roman Catholics, Episcopal and Orthodox orders were represented at the three-day gathering. Also present were members of the Taize Community, an ecumenical movement dedicated to Christian unity and understanding.

The same group is planning three-day meetings for 1988 and 1989.

Students from four local Catholic high schools participated in a Trivial Pursuit contest last month to benefit the Rochester Chapter of the Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders Association.

Federation of Catholic School Parents hosts statewide convention in Rochester

Father William O'Malley will be the keynote speaker at the annual New York state convention of the Federation of Catholic School Parents, to be held at the Rochester Plaza May 1-3. Scheduled events will also include a Mass celebrated by Bishop Matthew H. Clark and a workshop on childrearing, to be presented by Mary Elizabeth "Tipper" Gore.

Father O'Malley's address on "What Makes a School Catholic?" will be given at noon on Saturday, May 2. Currently on sabbatical from the faculty of McQuaid Jesuit High School, Father O'Malley now teaches at Boston College. The author of 15 books, he has published articles in a number of scholarly journals, including *The Catholic World*, *Jesuit Education Quarterly*, *Contemporary Literary Criticism* and *The English Journal*. He appeared in the Warner Brothers movie, *The Exorcist*, and is noted for his dramatic adaptations, recordings and television appearances on such programs as "The Today Show" and "The Mike Douglas Show."

Father O'Malley serves as a consultant to various organizations that include the Educational Testing Service, National Assessment of Writing, the Commission on Religious Education of the Jesuit Secondary Education Association, and the board of trustees of Loyola School in New York City.

"Tipper" Gore, the wife of Tennessee Senator Albert Gore Jr., is the author of *Raising PG Kids in an X-Rated Society*. Mrs. Gore was a co-founder of the Parents Music Resource Center, a non-profit organization devoted to educating parents and consumers about explicitly sexual and violent music lyrics. In November, 1985, the PMRC, the National Parent-Teacher Association and the Recording Industry Association announced an agreement by recording companies to identify recordings with explicit lyrics.

At the Federation of Catholic School Parents convention, Tipper Gore will present

a workshop on the topic of "Raising PG Kids," during which she will describe her lobbying efforts to have record albums rated for parental guidance. For her work on this issue, she was awarded the Christian World Affairs Conference's Woman of the Year Award for Outstanding Leadership of Youth.

Gore, who works as a freelance photographer in the Washington, D.C., area, is a member of the board of directors of the Capital Children's Museum, the Center for Science in the Public Interest and the committee for Food and Shelter. She was also appointed to serve on the American Academy of Pediatrics' Task Force on Children and TV.

Gore's workshop will be offered at three different times on Saturday, May 2. Other workshops for parents have also been scheduled, on such topics as building leadership skills and getting media coverage of events.

Bishop Matthew H. Clark will celebrate Mass at 5 p.m. on May 2, preceding a dinner that evening featuring entertainment by the Georgetown Chimes. An open meeting scheduled for Sunday morning, May 3, will offer parents an opportunity to voice their concerns and suggest topics for the statewide federation to address in the coming year.
